ESSER FUNDING OVERVIEW



ESSER (Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief) funding is a federal program established under the CARES Act (Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act) in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. The funding is designed to provide emergency aid to help K-12 schools address the impact of COVID-19 on education.

How funds are allocated



esser funds are allocated to states based on the Title I-A formula described above. Each state receives an allocation based on the proportion of Title I-A funds. States are required to distribute at least 90% of their esser funding to local educational agencies (LEAs), including school districts, charter schools, and other eligible entities.

What can the funds be used for

- Purchasing educational technology, such as hardware, software, and connectivity, for students and teachers to facilitate remote learning.
- Providing mental health services and supports for students and staff impacted by the pandemic.
- Supporting efforts to maintain the health and safety of students and staff, including personal protective equipment (PPE), cleaning supplies, and other measures.
